

Supportive Housing

What is supportive housing?

- Supportive housing is public housing for elders and younger disabled adults that need homemaking and personal care services. Supportive housing is for individuals who do not need 24-hour supervision or care.
- Residents pay 30% of their income in rent with the rest being subsidized by the state.
- Eligible residents receive services through one of our home care programs. Other residents can
 purchase services at a discount rate from one of our vendor agencies. In addition, all residents
 are eligible for homemaking and personal care services needed to address unforeseen or
 emergency needs on a 24/7 basis
- We currently offer this program at three locations: Fitchburg, Gardner, and Leominster.
- All residents of a supportive housing site are eligible to participate in a daily meal program and
 in recreational and educational activities arranged by out Housing Care Manager who will be onsite. Our case management staff also assists residents in identifying and accessing needed
 services.

Who is eligible?

• An individual must be 60 years of age or disabled and meet the income guidelines for public housing established by the Fitchburg, Gardner, and Leominster Housing Authorities in order to reside in a supportive housing building.
